UPON reading the joint application of the parties for amendment of the Dunedin City Council Electricity Department Employees' award, dated the 26th day of September, 1949, and recorded in 49 Book of Awards 2593: The Court, in pursuance and exercise of the powers vested in it by section 92 (1) (c) of the Industrial Conciliation and Arbitration Act, 1925, and of every other power in that behalf thereunto enabling it, and with the consent of the parties, doth hereby order as follows:—

1. That the said award shall be amended by deleting subclause (f) of clause 5 (Salaries), and substituting therefor the following subclause:—
