

NEW ZEALAND **PRIVATE HOTELS' EMPLOYEES**—EXEMPTING PARTIES  
FROM AWARD

In the Court of Arbitration of New Zealand, Northern Industrial District.—In the matter of the Industrial Conciliation and Arbitration Act, 1925, and its amendments; and in the matter of the New Zealand Private-hotels' Employees' award, dated the 11th day of November, 1949, and recorded in 49 Book of Awards 3521.

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred on it by section 92 (1) (a) of the Industrial Conciliation and Arbitration Act, 1925, and for the purpose of remedying a defect in the New Zealand Private-hotels Employees' award, dated the 11th day of November, 1949, this Court doth order as follows:—

1. That the said award shall be amended by striking out from the list of parties thereto the name of—

“Auckland Sailors' Home (J. L. Lomax, Manager), Auckland.”

2. That this order shall operate as from the day of the date hereof.
