In the matter of the New Zealand Bricklaying, Masonry, and Plastering Industries Apprenticeship Order, dated 27th September 1949, and recorded in 49 Book of Awards 2753.

By a resolution dated 24th November 1952 the New Zealand Bricklaying, Masonry and Plastering Apprenticeship Committee approved for the purpose of the proviso to clause 8 (a) of the above-mentioned order the following subjects of the School Certificate Examination: Any two of the following—mathematics, technical drawing, woodwork (including carpentry and joinery option).

NEW ZEALAND **BRICKLAYING, MASONRY, AND PLASTERING INDUSTRIES—**
AMENDMENT OF APPRENTICESHIP ORDER

In the Court of Arbitration of New Zealand.—In the matter of the Apprentices Act, 1948; and in the matter of the New Zealand Bricklaying, Masonry, and Plastering Industries apprenticeship order, dated the 27th day of September 1949, and recorded in 49 Book of Awards 2753.

WHEREAS by section 13 (2) of the Apprentices Act, 1948, the Court is empowered to amend any apprenticeship order: And whereas application has been made to the Court by the New Zealand Bricklaying, Masonry, and Plastering Apprenticeship Committee for amendment of the New Zealand Bricklaying, Masonry, and Plastering Industry apprenticeship order, dated the 27th day of September 1949, and recorded in 49 Book of Awards 2753: And whereas the Court has considered the recommendations made to it by the said Committee: Now, therefore, the Court, in pursuance and exercise of the powers vested in it by the said Act, doth hereby order as follows:—

1. That the said apprenticeship order shall be amended in the manner following:—

(1) By adding to subclause (a) of clause 8 (Term of Apprenticeship) the following proviso:—

“Provided that after the 24th day of November 1952 the term of apprenticeship of an apprentice who commences before his eighteenth birthday and who has obtained a School Certificate including such subjects as are approved from time to time by the New Zealand Apprenticeship Committee shall be 8,000 hours, divided into eight 1,000-hour periods.”

(2) By adding to subclause (a) of clause 11 (Wages) the following new column:—
