

NEW ZEALAND (EXCEPT WELLINGTON INDUSTRIAL DISTRICT OTHER THAN HAWKE'S BAY AND WANGANUI DISTRICTS) **AMBULANCE DRIVERS**—AMENDMENT OF AWARD

In the Court of Arbitration of New Zealand.—In the matter of the Industrial Conciliation and Arbitration Act, 1925, and the Economic Stabilization Regulations 1952 ; and in the matter of the New Zealand (except Wellington Industrial District other than Hawke's Bay and Wanganui Districts) Ambulance Drivers award, dated the 30th day of April 1951, and recorded in 51 Book of Awards 268.

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers vested in it by the Economic Stabilization Regulations 1952, and of every other power in that behalf thereunto enabling it, this Court, for the purpose of giving effect to the pronouncement made by it on the 12th day of July 1952, doth hereby order as follows :—

1. That the said award shall be amended in the manner following :—

(1) By deleting subclauses (a) and (b) of clause 4 (Wages) and substituting the following subclauses :—

“ *Wages*

“ (a) The minimum weekly wage for ambulance-drivers covered by this award shall be £9 12s. 4d. per week.

“ (b) Where a driver is placed in charge of other drivers he shall be paid 11s. 6d. per week extra.”

(2) By deleting clause 5 (Increase in Rates of Remuneration).

(3) By deleting from the undermentioned clauses the figures and symbols set out in the first column hereunder and substituting in each case the figures and symbols respectively set out in the second column hereunder :—

2. That this order shall come into force on the 1st day of September 1952.
