NEW ZEALAND (EXCEPT WESTLAND) FORESTRY WORKERS—AMENDMENT OF AWARD In the Court of Arbitration of New Zealand.—In the matter of the Industrial Conciliation and Arbitration Act, 1925, and the Economic Stabilization Regulations 1952; and in the matter of the New Zealand (except Westland) Forestry Workers award, dated the 18th day of March 1949, and recorded in 49 Book of Awards 545.

In pursuance and exercise of the powers vested in it by the Economic Stabilization Regulations 1952, and of every other power in that behalf thereunto enabling it, this Court, for the purpose of giving effect to the pronouncement made by it on the 12th day of July 1952, doth hereby order as follows:—

- 1. That the said award shall be amended in the manner following:-
- (1) By deleting subclause (a) of clause 6 (Wages) and substituting the following subclause:—
