

WELLINGTON INDUSTRIAL DISTRICT **MALE HAIRDRESSERS AND TOBACCONISTS'**
ASSISTANTS—AMENDMENT OF AWARD

In the Court of Arbitration of New Zealand.—In the matter of the Industrial Conciliation and Arbitration Act, 1925, and the Economic Stabilization Regulations 1952; and in the matter of the Wellington Industrial District Male Hairdressers and Tobacconists' Assistants award, dated the 12th day of December 1950, and recorded in 50 Book of Awards 2252.

In pursuance and exercise of the powers vested in it by the Economic Stabilization Regulations 1952, and of every other power in that behalf thereunto enabling it, this Court, for the purpose of giving effect to the pronouncement made by it on the 12th day of July 1952, doth hereby order as follows:—

1. That the said award shall be amended in the manner following:—

(1) By deleting clauses 3 and 10 and substituting the following clauses:—

“ *Wages* ”

“ 3. (a) The minimum wage for journeymen or journeywomen employed on men’s work shall be £9 16s. 11d. per week. Managers or worker in charge of saloon or shop £11 13s. 2d. per week.

“ (b) Casual workers shall be paid 5s. 2¼d. per hour with a minimum of three hours’ continuous employment.

“ (c) Wages shall be paid in full not later than Wednesday of each week.”

“ *Females (Shop Assistants)* ”

“ 10. Females employed in the shop as saleswomen shall be paid as follows :—

(2) By inserting after clause 15 the following new clause :—

“ *Exclusion from Operation of General Order* ”

“ 16. The rates of remuneration provided for in this award shall *not* be subject to the provisions of the general order of the Court, dated the 30th January 1951, and made under the Economic Stabilization Regulations 1950.”

2. That this order shall come into force on the 1st day of September 1952.
