

OTAGO AND SOUTHLAND **CANISTER WORKERS**—AMENDMENT OF AWARD

In the Court of Arbitration of New Zealand.—In the matter of the Industrial Conciliation and Arbitration Act, 1925, and the Economic Stabilization Regulations 1952; and in the matter of the Otago and Southland Canister Workers award, dated the 5th day of October 1951, and recorded in 51 Book of Awards 1782.

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers vested in it by the Economic Stabilization Regulations 1952, and of every other power in that behalf thereunto enabling it, this Court, for the purpose of giving effect to the pronouncement made by it on the 12th day of July 1952, doth hereby order as follows:—

1. That the said award shall be amended in the manner following:—

(1) By deleting clause 3 and substituting the following clause:—

“ *Wages*

“ 3. (a) *Adult Males*.—The minimum rate of pay for adult canister makers or repairers shall be 4s. 7 $\frac{3}{4}$ d. per hour.

“(b) Hand or dip solderers shall be paid 1½d. per hour extra while so employed ; but this shall not apply to workers employed at spiriting or sweating or operating automatic soldering lock seamers.

“(c) *Junior Males.*—The minimum weekly wages for junior males shall be as follows :—

Thereafter, or on attaining the age of twenty-one years, not less than the adult rates herein provided.”

(2) By deleting subclause (b) of clause 4 (Employment of Females) and substituting the following subclause :—

“(b) Female workers shall be paid not less than the following weekly rates :—

Thereafter, or on attaining the age of twenty-one years, not less than £5 17s. 4d. per week.”

(3) By deleting clause 5 (Increase in Rates of Remuneration).

(4) By deleting from clause 6 (Overtime) the figure and symbol “3s.” and substituting the figures and symbols “3s. 6d.”

2. That this order shall come into force on the 1st day of September 1952.
