

NORTHERN, WELLINGTON, CANTERBURY, AND OTAGO AND SOUTHLAND
STAGE EMPLOYEES—AMENDMENT OF AWARD

In the Court of Arbitration of New Zealand.—In the matter of the Industrial Conciliation and Arbitration Act, 1925, and the Economic Stabilization Regulations 1952; and in the matter of the Northern, Wellington, Canterbury, and Otago and Southland Stage Employees award, dated the 20th day of December 1951, and recorded in 51 Book of Awards 2245.

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers vested in it by regulation 9 (1) of the Economic Stabilization Regulations 1952, and upon application made in that behalf by the parties to the above-mentioned award, this Court, for the purpose of giving effect to the pronouncement made by it on the 12th day of July 1952, doth hereby order as follows:—

1. That the said award shall be amended in the manner following:—

(1) By deleting subclause (a) of clause 3 (Wages) and substituting the following subclause:—

“(a) The following shall be the minimum rates of wages payable to the undermentioned classes of workers:—
