IMPERIAL CHEMICAL INDUSTRIES (N.Z.), LIMITED, METAL SLIDE FASTENERS FACTORY EMPLOYEES—AMENDMENT OF AWARD

In the Court of Arbitration of New Zealand.—In the matter of the Industrial Conciliation and Arbitration Act, 1925, and the Economic Stabilization Regulations 1952; and in the matter of the Imperial Chemical Industries (N.Z.), Limited, Metal Slide Fasteners Factory Employees award, dated the 21st day of December 1949, and recorded in 49 Book of Awards 3802.

In pursuance and exercise of the powers vested in it by the Economic Stabilization Regulations 1952, and of every other power in that behalf thereunto enabling it, this Court, for the purpose of giving effect to the pronouncement made by it on the 12th day of July 1952, doth hereby order as follows:—

- 1. That the said award shall be amended in the manner following:—
- (1) By deleting from clause 3 (Shifts) the figure and symbol "3s." and substituting the figures and symbols "3s. 6d."
 - (2) By deleting clauses 7 and 8 and substituting the following clauses:—
