#### NEW ZEALAND HOSPITAL BOARDS' PHARMAGISTS—AMENDMENT OF AWARD

In the Court of Arbitration of New Zealand.—In the matter of the Industrial Conciliation and Arbitration Act, 1925, and the Economic Stabilization Regulations 1952; and in the matter of the New Zealand Hospital Boards' Pharmacists award, dated the 11th day of April 1949, and recorded in 49 Book of Awards 673.

In pursuance and exercise of the powers vested in it by the Economic Stabilization Regulations 1952, and of every other power in that behalf thereunto enabling it, this Court, for the purpose of giving effect to the pronouncement made by it on the 12th day of July 1952, doth hereby order as follows:—

- 1. That the said award shall be amended in the manner following:-
- (1) By deleting clauses 4, 5, and 6 and substituting the following clauses:—

<sup>&</sup>quot;Pharmacists employed on other duties which do not come within the schedule provided shall be paid such rate as is agreed upon between the Board and the union concerned.

## " Part-time Workers

<sup>&</sup>quot;Any worker who is in receipt of a higher rate than those provided in this award shall not have his wages reduced."

<sup>&</sup>quot;5. A part-time worker shall be paid 6s. 5\(^3\)d. per hour if employed for not more than thirty hours in any week. If employed for more than thirty hours in any week the appropriate weekly wage shall be paid."

# "Casual Workers

- "6. (a) For casual qualified pharmacists the rate of remuneration shall be 6s. 7½d. per hour between the hours 8 a.m. and 5 p.m., Monday to Friday, and between 8 a.m. and noon on Saturdays; outside these hours and on Saturdays after noon and on Sundays and holidays 12s. 6d. per hour shall be paid.
- "(b) For casual unqualified assistants the rate of remuneration shall be 5s. 11d. per hour between the hours 8 a.m. and 5 p.m. Monday to Friday, and between 8 a.m. and noon on Satudays; outside these hours and on Saturdays after noon and on Sundays and holidays 11s. per hour shall be paid."
  - (2) By inserting after clause 6 the following new clause:—

# " Exclusion from Operation of General Order

- "6A. The rates of remuneration provided for in this award shall not be subject to the provisions of the general order of the Court, dated the 30th January 1951, and made under the Economic Stabilization Regulations 1950."
- (3) By deleting from the undermentioned clauses the figures and symbols set out in the first column hereunder and substituting in each case the figures and symbols respectively set out in the second column hereunder:—
