

NEW ZEALAND **LEATHER, SADDLERY, AND CANVAS-GOODS INDUSTRIES—**
 AMENDMENT OF APPRENTICESHIP ORDER

In the Court of Arbitration of New Zealand—In the matter of the Apprentices Act, 1948; and in the matter of the New Zealand Leather, Saddlery, and Canvas-goods Industries Apprenticeship Order, dated the 21st day of December 1948, and recorded in 48 Book of Awards 2672.

WHEREAS by section 13 (2) of the Apprentices Act, 1948, the Court is empowered to amend any apprenticeship order: And whereas application has been made to the Court by the New Zealand Saddlery and Canvas-goods-making Apprenticeship Committee for amendment of the New Zealand Leather, Saddlery, and Canvas-goods Industries Apprenticeship Order, dated the 21st day of December 1948, and recorded in 48 Book of Awards 2672: And whereas the Court has considered the recommendations made to it by the said Committee: Now therefore, the Court, in pursuance and exercise of the powers vested in it by the said Act, doth hereby order as follows:

1. That the said apprenticeship order shall be amended by deleting subclause (a) of clause 8 (Proportion) and substituting the following subclause:

“(a) The proportion of the total number of apprentices to the total number of journeymen employed by any employer shall be not more than one to every journeyman employed in the branch in which the apprentice is apprenticed: Provided that on application by a local committee the New Zealand Committee may determine the proportion of apprentices to journeymen that may be employed by any employer in the saddle-making and/or saddle-repairing and bridle and harness making and repairing industry.”

2. That this order shall operate from the day of the date hereof.
