NEW ZEALAND MEN'S HAIRDRESSING INDUSTRY—AMENDMENT OF APPRENTICESHIP ORDER

In the Court of Arbitration of New Zealand.—In the matter of the Apprentices Act 1948; and in the matter of the New Zealand Men's Hairdressing Industry apprenticeship order, dated the 29th day of March 1949, and recorded in 49 Book of Awards 243.

WHEREAS by section 13 (2) of the Apprentices Act 1948, the Court is empowered to amend any apprenticeship order: And whereas application has been made to the Court by the New Zealand Hairdressing Apprenticeship Committee for amendment of the New Zealand Men's Hairdressing Industry apprenticeship order, dated the 29th day of March 1949, and recorded in 49 Book of Awards 243: And whereas the Court has considered the recommendations made to it by the said Committee: Now, therefore, the Court, in pursuance and exercise of the powers vested in it by the said Act, doth hereby order as follows:—

1. That the said apprenticeship order shall be amended by adding to subclause (b) of clause 3 (Prior Consent of Committee) the following words:—

"'Facilities' shall include a chair for every person working in a saloon, including apprentices and working employers."

2. That this order shall operate as from the day of the date hereof. Dated this 9th day of February 1955.
