NEW ZEALAND PRIVATE HOTELS' EMPLOYEES—EXEMPTING PARTY FROM AWARD

In the Court of Arbitration of New Zealand, Wellington Industrial District.— In the matter of the Industrial Conciliation and Arbitration Act 1954; and in the matter of the New Zealand Private Hotels' Employees Award, dated the 11th day of August 1954, and recorded in 54 Book of Awards 897.

UPON reading the application made by the Women Students' Hostel Society Incorporated, Wellington, under section 154 of the Industrial Conciliation and Arbitration Act 1954 for exemption from the New Zealand Private Hotels' Employees award, dated the 11th day of August 1954, and recorded in 54 Book of Awards 897: And upon hearing the duly appointed representatives of the said society and of the industrial association of workers party to the said award, this Court doth order as follows:—

1. That the Women Students' Hostel Society Incorporated, Wellington, in respect of the hostels conducted by it at 216 and 282 The Terrace, Wellington, is hereby exempted from the provisions of the abovementioned award, so long as the present practice continues whereby during the periods when the premises are closed for vacations wages are paid to the workers who, but for this clause, would be covered by the provisions of the award.

2. That this order shall take effect on the day of the date hereof.
