

NEW ZEALAND COACH AND MOTOR-BODY BUILDING INDUSTRY—
AMENDMENT OF APPRENTICESHIP ORDER

In the Court of Arbitration of New Zealand—In the matter of the Apprentices Act 1948; and in the matter of the New Zealand Coach and Motor-body Building Industry Apprenticeship Order, dated the 3rd day of October 1955, and recorded in 55 Book of Awards 1457.

WHEREAS by section 13 (2) of the Apprentices Act 1948, the Court is empowered to amend any apprenticeship order: and whereas application has been made to the Court by the New Zealand Coach-building Apprenticeship Committee for amendment of the New Zealand Coach and Motor-body Industry Apprenticeship Order, dated the 3rd day of October 1955, and recorded in 55 Book of Awards 1457: and whereas the Court has considered the recommendations made to it by the said committee and has afforded the employers and workers in the industry an opportunity of being heard: now, therefore, the Court, in pursuance and exercise of the powers vested in it by the said Act, doth hereby order as follows:

1. That the said apprenticeship order shall be amended by deleting subclause (b) of clause 9 (Proportion) and substituting the following subclause:

“(b) In the panelbeating branch the proportion of the total number of apprentices to the total number of journeymen employed by any employer shall, subject to the approval of the local committee, be not more than one apprentice to every journeyman employed.”

2. That this order shall operate as from the day of the date hereof.
