

NEW ZEALAND **BOILERMAKING AND MOULDING INDUSTRIES**—AMENDMENT
OF APPRENTICESHIP ORDER

In the Court of Arbitration of New Zealand—In the matter of the Apprentices Act 1948; and in the matter of the New Zealand Boilermaking and Moulding Industries Apprenticeship Order, dated the 9th day of May 1949, and recorded in 49 Book of Awards 1078.

WHEREAS by section 13 (2) of the Apprentices Act 1948, the Court is empowered to amend any apprenticeship order: And whereas application has been made to the Court by the New Zealand Moulding and Boilermaking Apprenticeship Committee for amendment of the New Zealand Boilermaking and Moulding Industries Apprenticeship Order, dated the 9th day of May 1949, and recorded in 49 Book of Awards 1078: And whereas the Court has considered the recommendations made to it by the said committee: Now, therefore, the Court, in pursuance and exercise of the powers vested in it by the said Act, doth hereby order as follows:

1. That the said apprenticeship order shall be amended by adding to clause 19 (Obligations of Employer) the following new subclause:

“(e) (i) The employer shall see that each apprentice in the boilermaking industry is supplied with one 12 in. shifting spanner, one 14 in. stilson wrench, one 3 ft. rule, one 8 in. square, one pair 8 in. spring dividers, one scribe, one centre punch, one template punch, one 33 ft. flexible steel tape, and a locker (with key) to contain these tools, but after being once supplied the apprentice shall be responsible for the tools, and in the event of his leaving his employ before the completion of the contract all of the said tools shall be returned to the employer or replaced at the expense of the apprentice unless he can show that any of such tools have been damaged or broken in the carrying out of his work, or lost through no fault of his own.

(ii) The employer shall supply all other tools required, such tools to remain the property of the employer and not to be taken off the premises.”

2. That this order shall operate from the day of the date hereof.
