NEW ZEALAND BAKING AND PASTRYCOOKING INDUSTRY—AMENDMENT OF APPRENTICESHIP ORDER

In the Court of Arbitration of New Zealand—In the matter of the Apprentices Act 1948; and in the matter of the New Zealand Baking and Pastrycooking Industry Apprenticeship Order dated the 28th day of May 1948, and recorded in 48 Book of Awards 843.

WHEREAS by section 13 (2) of the Apprentices Act 1948, the Court is empowered to amend any apprenticeship order: And whereas application has been made to the Court by the New Zealand Bakers and Pastrycooks Apprenticeship Committee for amendment of the New Zealand Baking and Pastrycooking Industry Apprenticeship Order dated the 28th day of May 1948, and recorded in 48 Book of Awards 843: And whereas the Court has considered the recommendations made to it by the said Committee and has afforded the employers and workers in the industry an opportunity of being heard: Now therefore, the Court, in pursuance and exercise of the powers vested in it by the said Act, doth hereby order as follows:

1. That the said apprenticeship order shall be amended by deleting subclause (a) of clause 9 (Wages) and substituting therefor the following subclause:

"(a) The minimum weekly rates of wages payable to apprentices, male or female respectively, shall be the undermentioned percentages of the minimum weekly rate of wages for journeymen or journeywomen bakers and pastrycooks respectively as prescribed by the award or agreement relating to the employment of such journeymen or journeywomen for the time being and from time to time in force in the locality:
