

(b) In every establishment the employer shall, at all times keep a time and wages book showing in the case of each employee:

1. The name of the officer, together with his age if under twenty-one years.
2. The kind of work on which he is usually employed.
3. The hours worked on each day.
4. The wages paid on each pay-day and the date thereof, and
5. Such other particulars as are prescribed by regulations.

(c) Employers bound by this award shall, upon request by the union supply a list of their officers (eighteen years of age and over) covered by this award and the date of commencement of new employees: Provided however, that this request shall not be made more often than once every three months.

(d) The employer shall allow any officer or executive member of the union leave of absence on full pay to attend union business providing such leave does not exceed twelve hours in any period of three calendar months.

Increases in Rates of Remuneration

The rates of remuneration, excluding meal money, determined by this agreement shall be increased to the extent and in the manner prescribed by the general order of the Court made under the Economic Stabilisation Regulations 1953, and dated the 26th day of October 1954.

Term of Agreement

This agreement shall come into force on the 1st day of April 1956, and shall continue in force until the 31st day of March 1957.

CANTERBURY COAL-MINE EMPLOYEES—AMENDMENT OF AWARD

In the Court of Arbitration of New Zealand, Canterbury Industrial District.—In the matter of the Industrial Conciliation and Arbitration Act 1954; and in the matter of the Canterbury Coal-mine Employees award, dated the 30th day of August 1956.

UPON reading the joint application made by the parties to the Canterbury Coal-mine Employees award, dated the 30th day of August 1956; And upon being satisfied that all the original parties to the award are desirous that the award should be reviewed by it, the Court, in pursuance and exercise of the powers vested in it by section 162 (1) (b) of the Industrial Conciliation and Arbitration Act 1954, and with the consent of the parties, doth hereby order as follows:

1. That the said award shall be amended in the manner following—

(1) By deleting the figures and symbol "54s." wherever they appear in subclause (a) of clause 17 and substituting "56s." in each case.

(2) By deleting the first paragraph of subclause (e) of clause 17 and substituting the following paragraph—

“A minimum weekly wage shall be paid computed on each employee’s actual earnings (whether at piece-work, contract, or wage-rates), the rate being—
