

**NEW ZEALAND PRINTING AND PHOTO-ENGRAVING INDUSTRIES—AMENDMENT
OF APPRENTICESHIP ORDER**

In the Court of Arbitration of New Zealand—In the matter of the Apprentices Act 1948; and in the matter of the New Zealand Printing and Photo-engraving Industries Apprenticeship Order, dated the 29th day of November 1954, and recorded in 54 Book of Awards 1857.

WHEREAS by section 13 (2) of the Apprentices Act 1948, the Court is empowered to amend any apprenticeship order: And whereas application has been made to the Court by the New Zealand Printing and Photo-engraving Apprenticeship Committee for amendment of the New Zealand Printing and Photo-engraving Industries Apprenticeship Order, dated the 29th day of November 1954, and recorded in 54 Book of Awards 1857: And whereas the Court has considered the recommendations made to it by the said Committee: Now, therefore, the Court, in pursuance and exercise of the powers vested in it by the said Act, doth hereby order as follows:

1. That the said apprenticeship order shall be amended in the manner following:

(1) By deleting paragraph (a) of clause 1 (Industry to Which Order Applies) and substituting the following paragraph:

“(a) Printing industry in the following branches, namely, commercial hand typography, newspaper hand typography, commercial machine typography, newspaper machine typography, letter-press machining, flexographic (aniline) printing, lithography, bookbinding, paper-ruling, stereotyping and composing machine mechanics.”

(2) By adding to Part I of the Schedule to the order the following:

“FLEXOGRAPHIC (ANILINE) PRINTING

1. Flexographic stereo making: (a) preparation of forme, matrix moulding, impression, curing temperatures; (b) making stereotypes, knowledge of materials, shrinkage, stereotype thicknesses, curing temperatures and pressures; (c) preparation of stereoplates for machine mounting: cutting, grinding, adhesives.

2. Mounting of stereos on cylinders.

3. Make-ready, registration, impression, and machine adjustments for printing, control of tension of parent and rewind rolls, and operation of machine.

4. Flexographic ink colour mixing and reducing, adapting inks to material, knowledge of solvents.

5. Use of heat for drying, small tools and construction of machine, care of rollers, packaging films, foil, polythene and papers.

6. Calculation of yields of material.

7. Knowledge of the principles of letterpress printing.”

2. That this order shall operate from the day of the date hereof.
