

ALLIANCE FREEZING WORKS PROJECT EMPLOYEES—AMENDMENT OF INDUSTRIAL AGREEMENT

In the Court of Arbitration of New Zealand—In the matter of the Industrial Conciliation and Arbitration Act 1954, and the Economic Stabilisation Regulations 1953; and in the matter of the Alliance Freezing Works Project Employees Industrial Agreement, dated the 1st day of June 1958, and recorded in 58 Book of Awards 825.

UPON reading the application made by the parties to the Alliance Freezing Works Project Employees Industrial Agreement, dated the 1st day of June 1958, and recorded in 58 Book of Awards 825, the Court, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred on it by regulation 4 of the Economic Stabilisation Regulations 1953 and of every other power in that behalf enabling it, doth hereby order as follows:

1. That the said industrial agreement shall be amended in the manner following, that is to say:

- (a) Subject to the following provisions, all rates of remuneration determined by the said industrial agreement shall be increased by an amount equal to 5.085 per cent thereof;
- (b) There shall be excluded from the scope of this order such portion of the remuneration of each worker in each week as exceeds the amount of £15 6s. 10d.;
- (c) There shall also be excluded from the scope of this order all allowances in respect of tools, bicycles, motor vehicles, protective or special clothing, or special footwear.

2. That the increase provided for by this order shall apply to the unexcluded portion of the prescribed minimum remuneration of each worker.

3. That for the purposes of this order "remuneration" means salary or wages; and includes time and piece wages and overtime and bonus and other special payments; and also includes allowances, fees, commission, and every other emolument, whether in one sum or several sums; and also includes travelling expenses.

4. That this order shall be deemed to have come into force and to have been incorporated in the said industrial agreement on the 12th day of October 1959.
