

NEW ZEALAND BOILERMAKING AND MOULDING INDUSTRIES—
AMENDMENT OF APPRENTICESHIP ORDER

In the Court of Arbitration of New Zealand—In the matter of the Apprentices Act 1948; and in the matter of the New Zealand Boilermaking and Moulding Industries Apprenticeship Order dated the 14th day of May 1958, and recorded in 58 Book of Awards 506.

WHEREAS by section 13 (2) of the Apprentices Act 1948, the Court is empowered to amend any apprenticeship order: And whereas application has been made to the Court by the New Zealand Boilermaking and Moulding Apprenticeship Committee for amendment of the New Zealand Boilermaking and Moulding Industries Apprenticeship Order dated the 14th day of May 1958, and recorded in 58 Book of Awards 506: And whereas the Court has heard the representatives of the employers and workers in the industries and other persons concerned and has considered the recommendations made to it by the said committee: Now therefore, the Court, in pursuance and exercise of the powers vested in it by the said Act, doth hereby order as follows:

1. That the said apprenticeship order shall be amended by adding to clause 7 (Term of Apprenticeship) the following new subclause:

“(i) Where during any period of his apprenticeship except the final period an apprentice passes the Trade Certificate Examination of the New Zealand Trades Certification Board, his term of apprenticeship shall be reduced by six months, but where an apprentice qualifies by that examination during the final period of his apprenticeship, his term of apprenticeship shall be deemed to be completed from the date he produces to his employer a notification of his passing the examination.”

2. That this order shall operate and take effect as from the day of the date hereof.
