POVERTY BAY BUTCHERS-AMENDMENT OF AWARD

In the Court of Arbitration of New Zealand—In the matter of the Industria Conciliation and Arbitration Act 1954 and the Economic Stabilisation Regulations 1953: And in the matter of the Poverty Bay Butchers Award, dated the 18th day of December 1958, and recorded in 58 Book of Awards 2065.

WHEREAS on the 18th day of September 1959 the Court made a pronouncement under regulation 5A of the Economic Stabilisation Regulations 1953; and whereas the Gisborne Butchers' Employees Industrial Union of Workers, a party to the abovementioned award, has made application to the Court pursuant to regulation 5C of the said regulations to amend the said award by incorporating in such rates of remuneration as the Court thinks just and equitable, as an integral part of suc rates, the effect of the general order dated the 18th day of September 1959; and whereas at the request of the Court made pursuant to paragraph 6 of the said regulation 5C the representatives of the original parties to the said award have conferred on the application and have sent to the Court the terms of the agreement arrived at; now, therefore, the Court, in pursuance and exercise of the power conferred upon it by the said regulation 5C, doth hereby order as follows:

1. That the said award shall be amended in the manner following:

(1) By deleting subclauses (a), (b), and (c) of clause 5 (Wages) and substitutin the following subclauses:
