NEW ZEALAND PIANO REPAIRING AND TUNING INDUSTRY—AMENDMENT OF
APPRENTICESHIP ORDER

In the Court of Arbitration of New Zealand—In the matter of the Apprentices Act 1948; and in the matter of the New Zealand Piano Repairing and Tuning Industry Apprenticeship Order dated the 22nd day of December 1958, and recorded in 58 Book of Awards 1853.

WHEREAS by section 13 (2) of the Apprentices Act 1948, the Court is empowered to amend any apprenticeship order: And whereas application has been made to the Court by the New Zealand Piano Repairing and Tuning Apprenticeship Committee for amendment of the New Zealand Piano Repairing and Tuning Industry Apprenticeship Order dated the 22nd day of December 1958, and recorded in 58 Book of Awards 1853: And whereas the Court has considered the recommendations made to it by the said committee: Now therefore, the Court, in pursuance and exercise of the powers vested in it by the said Act, doth hereby order as follows:

1. That the said apprenticeship order shall be amended by deleting subclauses (a) and (b) of clause 9 (Proportion) and substituting therefor the following subclauses:
“(a) The proportion of the total number of apprentices to the total number of journeymen employed by any employer shall not be more than one to each journeyman.
(b) For the purposes of this order an employer who himself works at the industry and who employs at least one journeyman shall be entitled to count himself as a journeyman.”

2. That this order shall operate and take effect as from the day of the date hereof.
