

NEW ZEALAND SHEET METAL WORKING INDUSTRY—AMENDMENT OF  
APPRENTICESHIP ORDER

In the Court of Arbitration of New Zealand—In the matter of the Apprentices Act 1948; and in the matter of the New Zealand Sheet Metal Working Industry Apprenticeship Order dated the 14th day of October 1960, and recorded in 60 Book of Awards 2254.

WHEREAS by section 13 (2) of the Apprentices Act 1948, the Court is empowered to amend any apprenticeship order: And whereas application has been made to the Court by the New Zealand Sheet Metal Working, Tinsmithing, and Coppersmithing Apprenticeship Committee for amendment of the New Zealand Sheet Metal Working Industry Apprenticeship Order dated the 14th day of October 1960, and recorded in 60 Book of Awards 2254: And whereas the Court has considered the recommendations made to it by the said Committee: Now therefore, the Court, in pursuance and exercise of the powers vested in it by the said Act, doth hereby order as follows:

1. That the said apprenticeship order shall be amended by adding to subclause (b) of clause 11 (Wages) the following words:

“and if he produces to his employer a notification of a pass in the Trade Certificate Examination of that Board shall, from the date of production of the notification to his employer, be paid for the remainder of his apprenticeship at a rate of not less than 15s. a week in excess of the minimum rate provided in subclause (a) of this clause.”

2. That this order shall operate and take effect as from the day of the date hereof.
