

NEW ZEALAND MOTOR INDUSTRY—AMENDMENT OF APPRENTICESHIP ORDER
In the Court of Arbitration of New Zealand—In the matter of the Apprentices Act 1948; and in the matter of the New Zealand Motor Industry Apprenticeship Order dated the 26th day of February 1960 and recorded in 60 Book of Awards 272.

WHEREAS by section 13 (2) of the Apprentices Act 1948, the Court is empowered to amend any apprenticeship order: And whereas application has been made to the Court by the New Zealand Motor Trades Apprenticeship Committee for amendment of the New Zealand Motor Industry Apprenticeship Order dated the 26th day of February 1960, and recorded in 60 Book of Awards 272: And whereas the Court has considered the recommendations made to it by the said Committee: Now therefore, the Court, in pursuance and exercise of the powers vested in it by the said Act, doth hereby order as follows:

1. That the said apprenticeship order shall be amended by deleting paragraphs (i) and (ii) of subclause (b) of clause 11 (Wages) and substituting the following paragraphs:

“(b) (i) Every apprentice who produces to his employer a notification from the New Zealand Trades Certification Board that he has passed or been exempted from the First Qualifying Examination of that Board, as approved by the New Zealand Motor Trade Certification Board, shall, provided he has completed 4,000 hours of apprenticeship, be entitled to an additional 5s. a week from the date of the production of the notification.

(ii) Every apprentice who produces to his employer a notification from the New Zealand Trades Certification Board that he has passed or been exempted from the Second Qualifying Examination of the Board, as approved by the New Zealand Motor Trade Certification Board, shall, provided he has completed 6,000 hours of apprenticeship, be entitled to a further additional 5s. a week from the date of the production of the notification.”

2. That this order shall operate and take effect as from the day of the date hereof.
