

NEW ZEALAND SHIP, YACHT, AND BOAT BUILDING INDUSTRY—AMENDMENT
OF APPRENTICESHIP ORDER

In the Court of Arbitration of New Zealand—In the matter of the Apprentices Act 1948; and in the matter of the New Zealand Ship, Yacht, and Boat Building Industry Apprenticeship Order, dated the 7th day of May 1958, and recorded in 58 Book of Awards 609.

WHEREAS by section 13 (2) of the Apprentices Act 1948, the Court is empowered to amend any apprenticeship order: And whereas application has been made to the Court by the New Zealand Ship, Yacht, and Boat Building and Shipwrighting and Coopering Apprenticeship Committee for amendment of the New Zealand Ship, Yacht, and Boat Building Industry Apprenticeship Order, dated the 7th day of May 1958, and recorded in 58 Book of Awards 609: And whereas the Court has considered the recommendations made to it by the said Committee: Now therefore, the Court, in pursuance and exercise of the powers vested in it by the said Act, doth hereby order as follows:

1. That the said apprenticeship order shall be amended in the manner following—

(1) By adding to clause 9 (Proportion) the following subclause:

“(e) For the purposes of this order “journeyman” shall mean a worker who has completed an apprenticeship in the industry, or who has had sufficient experience in the industry to satisfy the local committee of his competence in the relevant branch.”

(2) By adding at the end of subclause (a) of clause 10 (Wages) the following words and scale of percentages:

“For apprentices under eighteen years of age who have passed the School Certificate Examination including mathematics and who commence their apprenticeships after 12 December 1962:

First 1,000-hour period	37
Second 1,000-hour period	42
Third 1,000-hour period	47
Fourth 1,000-hour period	52
Fifth 1,000-hour period	57
Sixth 1,000-hour period	62
Seventh 1,000-hour period	67
Eighth 1,000-hour period	72
Ninth 1,000-hour period	77
Tenth 1,000-hour period	82

(3) By adding at the end of the Schedule of operations and skills for “Yacht and Boat Building and Repairing” the following item:

“Plywood and plastic construction of pleasure craft.”

2. That this order shall operate and take effect from the day of the date hereof.
