

NEW ZEALAND PAINTING AND DECORATING INDUSTRY—AMENDMENT OF
APPRENTICESHIP ORDER

In the Court of Arbitration of New Zealand—In the matter of the Apprentices Act 1948; and in the matter of the New Zealand Painting and Decorating Industry Apprenticeship Order, dated the 8th day of March 1961, and recorded in 61 Book of Awards 179.

WHEREAS by section 13 (2) of the Apprentices Act 1948, the Court is empowered to amend any apprenticeship order: And whereas application has been made to the Court by the New Zealand Painting and Decorating Apprenticeship Committee for amendment of the New Zealand Painting and Decorating Industry Apprenticeship Order, dated the 8th day of March 1961, and recorded in 61 Book of Awards 179: And whereas the Court has considered the recommendations made to it by the said committee: Now, therefore, the Court, in pursuance and exercise of the powers vested in it by the said Act, doth hereby order as follows:

1. That the said apprenticeship order shall be amended in the manner following:

(1) By deleting clause 18 and substituting therefor the following clause:

“18. *Tools*—The employer shall provide each apprentice with a full kit of tools as required by him from time to time to learn the branch of the industry to which he is apprenticed, but once during the term of apprenticeship. (See the Schedule to this order for minimum lists.)”

(2) By adding at the end of the Schedule to the order the following paragraph:

“The following is a minimum list of signwriters’ tools as required for the full kit mentioned in clause 18 of this order: full set of pencils, palette knife (small), putty knife, 3-in. stripping knife, 1¼ in. stopping knife, dusting brush, 3-ft-folding rule, gilding brush, knife, and tip (and pad if required), chamois leather, razor blade holder.”

2. That this order shall operate and take effect as from the day of the date hereof.
