

NEW ZEALAND RADIO INDUSTRY—AMENDMENT OF APPRENTICESHIP ORDER  
In the Court of Arbitration of New Zealand—In the matter of the Apprentices  
Act 1948; and in the matter of the New Zealand Radio Industry Apprenticeship  
Order, dated the 12th day of May 1961, and recorded in 61 Book of Awards  
550.

WHEREAS by section 13 (2) of the Apprentices Act 1948, the Court is empowered to amend any apprenticeship order: And whereas application has been made to the Court by the New Zealand Radio Manufacturing and Servicing Apprenticeship Committee for amendment of the New Zealand Radio Industry Apprenticeship Order, dated the 12th day of May 1961, and recorded in 61 Book of Awards 550: And whereas the Court has considered the recommendations made to it by the said Committee: Now therefore, the Court, in pursuance and exercise of the powers vested in it by the said Act, doth hereby order as follows:

1. That the said apprenticeship order shall be amended in the manner following:

(1) By adding at the end of subclause (h) of clause 8 (Term of Apprenticeship) the following sentence:

“The New Zealand Committee may approve of other examinations which it considers are equivalent to those mentioned in the first sentence of this subclause.”

(2) By adding to clause 10 (Proportion) the following subclause:

“(i) Notwithstanding anything in the preceding subclauses of this clause the New Zealand Committee may in special circumstances and on the recommendation of a local committee approve a proportion in excess of one to one for any employer in the servicing branch.”

2. That this order shall operate and take effect as from the day of the date hereof.
