

**AUCKLAND CITY DAILY NEWSPAPER JOURNALISTS—VARIATION OF INDUSTRIAL AGREEMENT**

THE industrial agreement made in pursuance of the Industrial Conciliation and Arbitration Act 1954 and its amendments, on the 14th day of October 1964, between the Auckland Journalists Union on the one part and Wilson and Horton Ltd., proprietors of the *New Zealand Herald*, and New Zealand Newspapers Ltd., proprietors of the *Auckland Star*, on the other part, is mutually agreed by and between the said parties to be varied this 10th day of May 1965, as follows:

Sub-clause (g) of clause 3 to read:

(g) A “reader” is one employed as a corrector of printed matter in proof form for publication in a newspaper. A “trainee reader” is a person being trained as a reader and who may have served as a copyholder.

In subclause (a) of clause 8 the section of salaries under the heading “Readers” to be:
