

AUCKLAND HOSPITAL BOARD GARDENERS' AND LABOURERS'—VARIATION OF INDUSTRIAL AGREEMENT

THIS industrial agreement made in pursuance of the Industrial Conciliation and Arbitration Act 1954, this 24th day of June 1966, between the Auckland Hospital Board and the Auckland Suburban Local Bodies Labourers and Related Trades Industrial Union of Workers, whereby it is mutually agreed by and between the said parties that the industrial agreement made between the parties on the 26th day of November 1965, shall be and is thereby varied in the manner following:

(i) *Clause 4—Wages:* Subclauses (a), (b), (c), (d), (e), (f), (g), and (h):

Delete the provisions of these subclauses and insert:

(a) Foreman

A foreman is a worker who is placed in charge of institutional grounds and has control of other workers.

A foreman may be promoted to Grade 1 if, in the opinion of the board, advancement beyond Grade 2 is justified by reason of additional duties and responsibilities of the position or experience and ability of the worker, provided that in respect of Auckland and Middlemore Hospitals, the foreman shall be classified as Grade 1.

A foreman who is also a qualified gardener and specifically classified as such by the board shall be paid an additional 17s. 6d. per week over and above the rate for a Grade 1 foreman.

(b) Gardeners specifically classified as such 19 6 8

A gardener shall mean a worker who has served a full term horticultural apprenticeship or any worker whom the board may deem competent to carry out the work of a gardener.

(c) (i) Sole charge hospital groundsmen	17	12	6
A worker in sole charge of maintaining grounds and gardens and carrying out other duties, covered by this agreement, at a hospital.			
This classification and rate of wages shall apply as from 2 December 1963.			
(ii) Hospital groundsmen	16	19	2
A hospital groundsman shall mean a semi-skilled worker employed to carry out maintenance work in hospital grounds or gardens, but this does not include such skilled tasks as propagation, potting and charge of plants under glass.			
Hospital groundsmen when employed on scythe work or motor mowing, and ploughmen, shall be paid an additional 2d. per hour.

(f) Rat-catcher and drain cleaner	16	15	0
(g) Licensed drainlayer	19	0	0
(h) Incinerator attendants	17	9	2

Thereafter	17	9	2

(ii) That the amendments provided herein, other than rates of wages, shall be deemed to have come into force on the 26th day of November 1965, and the provisions as to rates of wages shall be deemed to have come into force on the 1st day of August 1965.
