

NEW ZEALAND BAKING AND PASTRYCOOKING INDUSTRY—AMENDMENT OF  
APPRENTICESHIP ORDER

In the Court of Arbitration of New Zealand—In the matter of the Apprentices Act 1948; and in the matter of the New Zealand Baking and Pastrycooking Industry Apprenticeship Order, dated the 18th day of December 1958, and recorded in 58 Book of Awards 1964.

WHEREAS by section 13 (2) of the Apprentices Act 1948, the Court is empowered to amend any apprenticeship order: And whereas application has been made to the Court by the New Zealand Bakers' and Pastrycooks' Apprenticeship Committee for amendment of the New Zealand Baking and Pastrycooking Industry Apprenticeship Order, dated the 18th day of December 1958, and recorded in 58 Book of Awards 1964: And whereas the Court has considered the recommendations made to it by the said Committee: Now, therefore, the Court, in pursuance and exercise of the powers vested in it by the said Act, doth hereby order as follows:

1. That the said apprenticeship order shall be amended by deleting clause 9 and substituting therefor the following clause:

“9. *Proportion*—The proportion of the total number of apprentices to the total number of journeymen or journeywomen employed by any employer shall not be more than one to every two or fraction of two journeymen or journeywomen employed: Provided that on the application of a local committee the New Zealand Committee may vary the proportion by fixing the number of apprentices that may be employed by any employer.”

2. That this order shall operate and take effect as from the day of the date hereof. Dated this 25th day of August 1967.
