

**NEW ZEALAND LEATHER, SADDLERY AND CANVAS GOODS INDUSTRIES—  
AMENDMENT OF APPRENTICESHIP ORDER**

In the Court of Arbitration of New Zealand—In the matter of the Apprentices Act 1948; and in the matter of the New Zealand Leather, Saddlery and Canvas-goods Industries Apprenticeship Order, dated the 27th day of April 1967, and recorded in 67 Book of Awards 816.

WHEREAS by section 13 (2) of the Apprentices Act 1948, the Court is empowered to amend any apprenticeship order: And whereas application has been made to the Court by the New Zealand Saddlery and Canvas-goods-making Apprenticeship Committee for amendment of the New Zealand Leather, Saddlery and Canvas-goods Industries Apprenticeship Order, dated the 27th day of April 1967, and recorded in 67 Book of Awards 816: And whereas the Court has considered the recommendations made to it by the said Committee: Now, therefore, the Court, in pursuance and exercise of the powers vested in it by the said Act, doth hereby order as follows:

1. That the said apprenticeship order shall be amended by deleting subclause (b) of clause 10 (Wages) and substituting therefor the following subclause:

“(b) An apprentice who has obtained a pass in School Certificate subjects giving admission to Form VI under Education Department criteria or other qualification approved by the New Zealand Committee shall be paid an allowance of not less than \$1 per week in addition to the minimum rate provided in subclause (a) of this clause.”

2. That this order shall operate and take effect as from the day of the date hereof.
