

NEW ZEALAND PLASTERING INDUSTRY – AMENDMENT
OF APPRENTICESHIP ORDER

In the Court of Arbitration of New Zealand—In the matter of the Apprentices Act 1948; and in the matter of the New Zealand Plastering Industry Apprenticeship Order, dated the 17th day of December 1968, and recorded in 68 Book of Awards

Whereas by section 13 (2) of the Apprentices Act 1948, the Court is empowered to amend any apprenticeship order: And whereas application has been made to the Court by the New Zealand Plastering Apprenticeship Committee for amendment of the New Zealand Plastering Industry Apprenticeship Order, dated the 17th day of December 1968: And whereas the Court has considered the recommendations made to it by the said Committee: Now therefore, the Court, in pursuance and exercise of the powers vested in it by the said Act, doth hereby order as follows:

1. That the said apprenticeship order shall be amended by deleting subclause (b) of clause 12 (Technical Classes) and substituting therefor the following subclause:

“(b) An apprentice ordered to attend as provided in subclause (a) of this clause may also be ordered to attend evening classes for not more than two hours a week for six school terms.”
2. That this order shall operate and take effect from the day of the date hereof.
