AMENDMENT OF APPRENTICESHIP ORDER

Dated 4/7/69

In the Court of Arbitration of New Zealand—In the matter of the Apprentices Act 1948; and in the matter of the New Zealand Leadburning and Chemical Plumbing Industry Apprenticeship Order, dated the 13th day of March 1950, and recorded in 50 Book of Awards 133.

Pursuant to section 13 (2) of the Apprentices Act 1948, the Court doth hereby order that the New Zealand Leadburning and Chemical Plumbing Industry Apprenticeship Order, dated the 13th day of March 1950, and recorded in 50 Book of Awards 133 and any amendments thereto, shall be cancelled from the day of the date hereof.

MEMORANDUM

This order results from an application made by the Commissioner of Apprenticeship, and upon the Court being satisfied that the cancellation is desired by the employers and workers in the industry and that there are now no contracts of apprenticeship in force. The Court has also discharged the New Zealand Apprenticeship Committee for the industry. Although there may no longer be any need for an order governing the conditions of apprenticeship in the industry, this does not necessarily mean that the Apprentices Act 1948 will cease to have application. It will still be possible for any future contracts to be registered under the Act, subject to the prior consent of the appropriate District Commissioner of Apprenticeship and upon such terms and conditions as may be acceptable to him for registration.
