

NEW ZEALAND ELECTRICAL INDUSTRY—AMENDMENT OF APPRENTICESHIP ORDER

In the Court of Arbitration of New Zealand—In the matter of the Apprentices Act 1948; and in the matter of the New Zealand Electrical Industry Apprenticeship Order, dated the 7th day of November 1969, and recorded in 69 Book of Awards p. 2331.

Whereas by section 13 (2) of the Apprentices Act 1948, the Court is empowered to amend any apprenticeship order: and whereas application has been made to the Court by the New Zealand Electrical Trades Apprenticeship Committee for amendment of the New Zealand Electrical Industry Apprenticeship Order, dated the 7th day of November 1969: and whereas the Court has considered the recommendations made to it by the said Committee: now, therefore, the Court, in pursuance and exercise of the powers vested in it by the said Act, doth hereby order as follows:

1. THAT the said apprenticeship order shall be amended in the manner following:
 - (1) By deleting the figures “500” whenever they appear in subclause (d) of clause 8 (Term of Apprenticeship) and substituting therefor in each case the figures “1,000”.
 - (2) By deleting subclause (e) of clause 8 (Term of Apprenticeship).
 - (3) By deleting the words “an ‘E’ class licence” at the end of subclause (a) of clause 10 (Proportion) and substituting therefor the words “an ‘E’ or ‘E.T.’ class licence”.
 - (4) By deleting from subclause (f) of clause 10 (Proportion) the words “who is the holder of a provisional licence of the Electricians’ Registration Board” and substituting therefor the words “who has passed the Trade Certificate Examination of the New Zealand Trades Certification Board.”
2. THAT this order shall operate and take effect as from the day of the date hereof.
