

NORTHERN INDUSTRIAL DISTRICT BRICK, TILE, POTTERY AND
PORCELAIN WORKERS — AMENDMENT OF AWARD

In the Court of Arbitration of New Zealand Northern Industrial District—In the matter of the Industrial Conciliation and Arbitration Act 1954; and in the matter of the Northern Industrial District Brick, Tile, Pottery and Porcelain Workers Award, dated the 7th day of October 1969, and recorded in 69 Book of Awards . . .

Upon reading the joint application made by the original parties to the Northern Industrial District Brick, Tile, Pottery and Porcelain Workers Award, dated the 7th day of October 1969: and upon being satisfied that the said parties are desirous that the award should be reviewed by it, The Court, in pursuance and exercise of the powers vested in it by section 162 (1) (b) of the Industrial Conciliation and Arbitration Act 1954, and with the consent of the said parties, doth hereby order as follows:

1. That the said award shall be amended in the manner following:

(1) By deleting subclause (a) of clause 10 (Wages) and substituting therefor the following subclause:

“(a) The minimum rate of wages for a male worker 20 years of age and over shall be:

	Per Hour cents
Moulding.....	104.6
Sticking.....	103.0
Quarrying and when working in clay pit.....	101.5

(NOTE — The margin of 4.1 cents per hour fixed for quarrying and when working in the clay pit includes computation for quarrymen using explosives and compensates men in the clay pit for wet conditions and enables them to provide suitable footwear.)

	Per Hour cents
Pipe inspector.....	100.9
A pipe inspector is a person whose main duties are inspecting and measuring pipes for rubber ring joints, using a precision measuring instrument to gauge size.	
Setting and drawing.....	100.7
Operating internal transport.....	100.1
Burning and tunnel-kiln attending.....	100.1
Machinists —	
Brick machine — worker in charge.....	99.2
Pipe machine — workers operating.....	98.3
All other workers.....	97.4

(2) By deleting subclause (a) of clause 11 (Youths) and substituting therefor the following subclause:

“(a) Male workers under 20 years of age shall be paid in accordance with the following scale:

	Per Week

Under 17 years of age.....	22.40
17 to 18 years of age.....	24.80
18 to 19 years of age.....	27.20
19 to 20 years of age.....	32.00

Thereafter the rate prescribed in clause 10 of this award for male workers over 20 years of age.”

- (3) By deleting the figures and words “25th day of March 1971” where they appear in the enacting sheet and in clause 24 (Term of Award) and substituting therefor in each case the figures and words “31st day of May 1971”.
- 2. That this order shall come into force on the day of the date hereof, except that in so far as it relates to the wages to be paid it shall be deemed to have come into force on the first day of the pay week commencing on or after the 31st day of May 1970.
