

WILSONS (N.Z.) PORTLAND CEMENT LTD. CEMENT WORKERS—
AMENDMENT OF AWARD

In the Court of Arbitration of New Zealand, Northern Industrial District—In the matter of the Industrial Conciliation and Arbitration Act 1954; and in the matter of the Wilsons (N.Z.) Portland Cement Ltd. Cement Workers Award, dated the 28th day of August 1970, and recorded in 70 Book of Awards 2874.

Upon reading the joint application made by the original parties to the Wilsons (N.Z.) Portland Cement Ltd. Cement Workers Award, dated the 28th day of August 1970: and upon being satisfied that the said parties are desirous that the award should be reviewed by it, the Court, in pursuance and exercise of the powers vested in it by section 162 (1) (b) of the Industrial Conciliation and Arbitration Act 1954, and with the consent of the said parties, doth hereby order as follows:

1. That the said award shall be amended by deleting clause 6 and substituting therefor the following clause:

“RATES OF PAY

6. The following shall be the minimum rates of pay:
