TARANAKI RACECOURSE EMPLOYEES—AMENDMENT OF AWARD

In the Court of Arbitration of New Zealand, Taranaki Industrial District—In the Industrial Conciliation and Arbitration Act 1954; and in the matter of the Taranaki Racecourse Employees Award, dated the 2nd day of July 1970, and recorded in 70 Book of Awards p. 5043.

Upon reading the joint application made by the original parties to the Taranaki Racecourse Employees Award, dated the 2nd day of July 1970: and upon being satisfied that the said parties are desirious that the award should be reviewed by it, the Court, in pursuance and exercise of the powers vested in it by section 162 (1) (b) of the Industrial Conciliation and Arbitration Act 1954, and with the consent of the said parties, doth hereby order as follows:

1. That the said award shall be amended in the manner following:

(1) By deleting subclauses (a) and (b) of clause 2 (Wages) and substituting therefor the following subclauses:

"(a) The minimum rates of wages shall be:

(b) The wages for casuals employed by the day on race days shall be a minimum of \$8.20."

- (2) By deleting the date "31st day of October 1971" where it appears in the enacting sheet and in clause 15 (Term of Award) and substituting therefor in each case the date "31st day of December 1971".
- 2. That for the purpose of removing doubts as to the operation of the general order of the Court made under the General Wage Orders Act 1969 and dated 3 November 1970, it is hereby declared that the amended rates of remuneration provided by this order shall, on and after 23 November 1970, be increased to the extent and in the manner prescribed by the said general order.
- 3. That this order shall come into force on the day of the date hereof, except that in so far as it relates to the rates of wages to be paid it shall be deemed to have come into force on the first day of the pay week in each establishment commencing on or after the 2nd day of August 1970.
