

NEW ZEALAND AIRCRAFT WORKERS—ORDER VARYING  
APPLICATION OF GENERAL ORDER

In the Court of Arbitration of New Zealand—In the matter of the Industrial Conciliation and Arbitration Act 1954 and of the General Wage Orders Act 1969; and in the matter of the New Zealand Aircraft Workers Award, dated the 8th day of October 1970, and recorded in 70 Book of Awards 3 324 .

Upon reading the joint application made by Air New Zealand Limited, New Zealand National Airways Corporation, Safe Air Limited, and the New Zealand Engineering, Coachbuilding, Aircraft, Motor and Related Trades Industrial Union of Workers, parties to the New Zealand Aircraft Workers Award, dated the 8th day of October 1970, the Court, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred on it by section 6 of the General Wage Orders Act 1969 and of every other power in that behalf enabling it, doth hereby order as follows:

1. That workers whose employment is subject to the said award and who are employed by Air New Zealand Limited, New Zealand National Airways Corporation, and Safe Air Limited shall be excluded from the operation of the general order of 3 November 1970 in so far as the rates of remuneration determined by clauses 8 and 13 of the said award are concerned, but not otherwise.

2. That this order shall be deemed to have come into force on the 23rd day of November 1970.
