

**NEW ZEALAND RETAIL MEAT INDUSTRY –
AMENDMENT OF APPRENTICESHIP ORDER**

In the Court of Arbitration of New Zealand – In the matter of the Apprentices Act 1948; and in the matter of the New Zealand Retail Meat Industry Apprenticeship Order, dated the 8th day of November 1963, and recorded in 63 Book of Awards 2265.

Whereas by section 13 (2) of the Apprentices Act 1948, the Court is empowered to amend any apprenticeship order: And whereas application has been made to the Court by the New Zealand Retail Meat Industry Apprenticeship Committee for amendment of the New Zealand Retail Meat Industry Apprenticeship Order, dated the 8th day of November 1963, and recorded in 63 Book of Awards 2265: And whereas the Court has considered the recommendations made to it by the said Committee: Now, therefore, the Court, in pursuance and exercise of the powers vested in it by the said Act, doth hereby order as follows:

1. That the said apprenticeship order shall be amended in the manner following:

(1) By deleting subclause (a) of clause 9 (Proportion) and substituting therefor the following subclause –

“(a) (i) The proportion of the total number of apprentices to the total number of journeymen employed by an employer shall not be more than one apprentice to every two or fraction of two journeymen employed.

(ii) Notwithstanding the foregoing provision the New Zealand Committee, on the recommendation of a local committee may approve of a proportion in excess of one to two or fraction of two in cases where the local committee has been satisfied that the employer has the necessary facilities for teaching the industry.”

(2) By inserting between the named subjects “science” and “book-keeping” in clause 10 (Wages) the subject “biology”.

2. That this order shall operate from the day of the date hereof.
