CLOTHING TECHNICIAN CADETS - INDUSTRIAL AGREEMENT

This industrial agreement, made in pursuance of the Industrial Conciliation and Arbitration Act 1954 this 24th day of May, 1972, between the New Zealand Federated Clothing Trades Employees' Industrial Association of Workers (hereinafter called "the union") of the one part, and the New Zealand Textile and Garment Industrial Union of Employers, (hereinafter called "the employer") of the other part, whereby it is mutually agreed by and between the said parties as set out in the following schedule.

SCHEDULE

APPLICATION OF AGREEMENT

1. This industrial agreement shall apply to clothing technician cadets who have completed the two year full time study course at a technical institute and who are undergoing practical training in the clothing, shirt, white and silk working and/or dressmaking and millinery industries for the third and fourth years to complete the course.

PROVISIONS OF AWARD TO APPLY

2. The provisions of the relevant industry awards for the time being in force relating to hours of work, overtime, holidays, annual holidays, general provisions, disputes and unqualified preference shall apply to clothing technician cadets employed in terms of this industrial agreement.

TERMINATION OF EMPLOYMENT

3. One week's notice of the termination of employment shall be given by either party failing which one week's wages shall be paid or forfeited as the case may be: provided that nothing in this clause shall prevent the summary termination of employment for misconduct.

WAGES

4. The minimum wages payable to a clothing technician cadet shall be:
