

**NORTH AUCKLAND AND AUCKLAND LADIES' HAIRDRESSERS
ASSISTANTS – AMENDMENT OF AWARD**

In the Court of Arbitration of New Zealand – In the matter of the Industrial Conciliation and Arbitration Act 1954 and the Equal Pay Act 1972 and the Economic Stabilisation Regulations 1973; And in the matter of the North Auckland and Auckland Ladies' Hairdressers Assistants Award, dated the 5th day of July 1972, and recorded in 72 Book of Awards 2790.

In pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred on it by subsection (4A) of section 4 of the Equal Pay Act 1972: And upon application made in that behalf by the duly authorised agents of the parties to the industrial dispute that was settled by the North Auckland and Auckland Ladies' Hairdressers Assistants Award, dated the 5th day of July 1972: And upon being satisfied that the application is for the purpose of giving effect to provisions of that Act and is not inconsistent with the requirements of the Economic Stabilisation Regulations 1973: The Court doth hereby order as follows:

1. That the said award shall be amended by deleting subclause (a) of clause 7 (Wages) and substituting therefor the following subclause –

“(a) Female assistants may be employed at not less than the following rates of wages:

	Per Week
	\$
First six months	22.00
Second six months	24.00
Third six months	27.50
Fourth six months	31.00
Fifth six months	34.50
Sixth six months	38.00
Seventh six months	41.50
Eighth six months	45.00
Thereafter for journeywomen	50.00

A manageress shall be paid not less than \$56.17 per week.

(NOTE – Attention is drawn to the requirements of the Minimum Wage Act 1945 and any Minimum Wage Orders made pursuant thereto. The Minimum Wage Order (No. 2) 1973 S.R. 1973/257 effective on and from 1 November 1973 fixes a minimum wage of \$37.60 a week for female workers on attaining 20 years of age.)”

2. That this order shall be deemed to have come into force on the 1st day of October 1973.
