

NEW ZEALAND LEATHER, SADDLERY, AND CANVAS-GOODS
INDUSTRIES – AMENDMENT OF APPRENTICESHIP ORDER

Dated 6/6/75

In the Industrial Court of New Zealand – In the matter of the Apprentices Act 1948; and in the matter of the New Zealand Leather, Saddlery, and Canvas-Goods Industries Apprenticeship Order, dated the 27th day of April 1967, and recorded in 67 Book of Awards 816.

Whereas by section 13 (2) of the Apprentices Act 1948, the Industrial Court is empowered to amend any apprenticeship order: And whereas application has been made to the Court by the New Zealand Saddlery and Canvas-Goods-Making Apprenticeship Committee for amendment of the New Zealand Leather, Saddlery, and Canvas-Goods Industries Apprenticeship Order, dated the 27th day of April 1967: And whereas the Court has considered the recommendations made to it by the said Committee: Now, therefore, the Court, in pursuance and exercise of the powers vested in it by the said Act, doth hereby order as follows:

1. That the said apprenticeship order shall be amended by inserting after subclause (d) of clause 9 (Proportion) the following new subclause –

“(dd) Notwithstanding the foregoing provisions of the New Zealand Committee, on the recommendation of the local committee, may approve a proportion in excess of one to one in cases where the local committee is satisfied that the employer has the necessary facilities for teaching the branch of the industry.”

2. That this order shall operate and take effect as from the day of the date hereof.
