NEW ZEALAND HORTICULTURAL AND GARDENING INDUSTRY – AMENDMENT OF APPRENTICESHIP ORDER

Dated 28/5/75

In the Industrial Court of New Zealand – In the matter of the Apprentices Act 1948; and in the matter of the New Zealand Horticultural and Gardening Industry Apprenticeship Order, dated the 5th day of April 1974, and recorded in 74 Book of Awards 87.

Whereas by section 13 (2) of the Apprentices Act 1948, the Industrial Court is empowered to amend any apprenticeship order: And whereas application has been made to the Court by the New Zealand Horticultural and Gardening Apprenticeship Committee for amendment of the New Zealand Horticultural and Gardening Industry Apprenticeship Order, dated the 5th day of April 1974: And whereas the Court has considered the recommendations made to it by the said Committee: Now, therefore, the Court, in pursuance and exercise of the powers vested in it by the said Act, doth hereby order as follows:

1. That the said apprenticeship order shall be amended by deleting paragraphs (i), (ii), and (iii) of subclause (c) of clause 10 (Wages) and substituting therefor the following paragraphs –

“(i) An apprentice passing the First Qualifying Examination as prescribed by the New Zealand Trades Certification Board shall be paid not less than \$1 a week in addition to the minimum rate prescribed in subclause (a) of this clause from date of the granting of a pass in this examination.

(ii) An apprentice passing the Second Qualifying Examination as prescribed by the New Zealand Trades Certification Board shall be paid not less than \$1.50 a week in addition to the minimum rate prescribed in subclause (a) of this clause from the date of the granting of a pass in this examination.

(iii) An apprentice passing the Trade Certificate Examination as prescribed by the New Zealand Trades Certification Board shall be paid not less than \$2 a week in addition to the minimum rate prescribed in subclause (a) of this clause from the date of the granting of a pass in this examination.”

2. That this order shall operate and take effect as from the day of the date hereof.
