AMENDMENT OF THE NEW ZEALAND PLASTERING INDUSTRY
APPRENTICESHIP ORDER 17/12/68

Dated 18/11/75

In the Industrial Court of New Zealand – In the matter of the Apprentices Act 1948; and in the matter of the New Zealand Plastering Industry Apprenticeship Order, dated the 17th day of December 1968 and recorded in 68 Book of Awards 2164.

Whereas by section 13 (2) of the Apprentices Act 1948, the Industrial Court is empowered to amend any apprenticeship order: and whereas application has been made to the Court by the New Zealand Plastering Apprenticeship Committee for amendment of the New Zealand Plastering Industry Apprenticeship Order, dated the 17th day of December 1968: and whereas the Court has considered the recommendations made to it by the said Committee: now, therefore, the Court, in pursuance and exercise of the powers vested in it by the said Act, doth hereby order as follows:

1. That the said apprenticeship order shall be amended by adding after subclause (f) of clause 10 (Proportion) the following new subclause:

“(g) Notwithstanding the foregoing provisions, where a local committee is satisfied that an employer has the facilities to provide adequate training, it may approve of an employer having one extra apprentice in excess of the proportion set out in subclauses (a) and (b) above.”

2. That this order shall operate and take effect as from the day of the date hereof.
