

NEW ZEALAND COACH AND MOTOR-BODY BUILDING INDUSTRY –
AMENDMENT OF APPRENTICESHIP ORDER

Dated 6/4/76

In the Industrial Court of New Zealand – In the matter of the Apprentices Act 1948; and in the matter of the New Zealand Coach & Motor-Body Building Industry Apprenticeship Order dated the 31st day of July 1969 and recorded in the 69 Book of Awards 1541.

Whereas by section 13 (2) of the Apprentices Act 1948, the Industrial Court is empowered to amend any apprenticeship order: and whereas application has been made to the Court by the New Zealand Coachbuilding Apprenticeship Committee for amendment of the New Zealand Coach and Motor-Body Building Industry Apprenticeship Order, dated the 31st day of July 1969: And whereas the Court has considered the recommendations made to it by the said Committee: Now, therefore, the Court, in pursuance and exercise of the powers vested in it by the said Act, doth hereby order as follows:

1. That the said apprenticeship order shall be amended by:

(1) Adding after paragraph (iii) of subclause (a) of clause 8 (Term of Apprenticeship) the following new paragraph:

“(iv) In the radiator repairing branch the term of apprenticeship shall be 6,000 hours divided into six 1,000 periods.”

(2) Adding the following to paragraph (i) of subclause (a) of clause 11 (Wages):

“For apprentices in radiator repairing –				Percent
First 1,000 hour period	45
Second 1,000 hour period	54
Third 1,000 hour period	63
Fourth 1,000 hour period	72
Fifth 1,000 hour period	81
Sixth 1,000 hour period	90”

2. That this order shall operate and take effect as from the day of the date hereof.
