

# NEW ZEALAND CARPENTRY AND JOINERY INDUSTRY – AMENDMENT TO APPRENTICESHIP ORDER

Dated 13/8/76

In the Industrial Court of New Zealand – In the matter of the Apprentices Act 1948; and in the matter of the New Zealand Carpentry and Joinery Industry Apprenticeship Order dated the 20th day of December 1974 and recorded in the 74 Book of Awards 3841.

Whereas by section 13 (2) of the Apprentices Act 1948, the Industrial Court is empowered to amend any apprenticeship order: and whereas application has been made to the Court by the New Zealand Carpentry and Joinery Apprenticeship Committee for amendment of the New Zealand Carpentry and Joinery Industry Apprenticeship Order dated the 20th day of December 1974: And whereas the Court has considered the recommendations made to it by the said Committee: Now, therefore, the Court, in pursuance and exercise of the powers vested in it by the said Act, doth hereby order as follows:

1. (1) By deleting the Second Schedule and substituting therefore the following schedule:

## “SECOND SCHEDULE

### TOOLS AND TEXTBOOKS

In accordance with subclause (b) of clause 18 of this Order, the employer shall arrange for the supply of the necessary first grade tools as set out below plus the textbook appropriate to the trade.

Tools shall be available to the apprentice as indicated below.

1. To be supplied to apprentices in the Carpentry and Joinery branches –  
(\*Not required by Joiners)

Text book “Carpentry in New Zealand” or “Joinery”.

Tool kit, bag

Apron or nail bag

Claw hammer

1 m Folding type rule, graduated in mm

5 m Spring tape, graduated in mm

Carpenter's pencils

3 Nail punches small, medium and large

300 mm Combination square

\*Chalk line

\*Pinch bar

\*Pliers

\*Plumb bob

\*Tin snips

Spiral screwdriver with changeable bits

Marking gauge

Ratchet brace

Wood bits sizes No. 16, 10, 8, 6 and 4

Bit roll

Butt gauge

Wood rasps medium and coarse

Counter-sink bit

Phillips screwdrivers small and medium

7 or 8 point Hand saw

38 mm Butt chisel  
 25 mm Firmer chisel  
 13 mm Bevel chisel  
 750 mm Spirit level  
 225 mm Bevel  
 Saw bag with pocket for level  
 Saw set  
 4 or 5 point Rip saw  
 10 or 11 point Panel saw

For Joiners only — on completion of 2000 hours —

 6 mm and 8 mm Bevel chisels  
 13 mm Gouge (externally ground)

2. To be supplied to apprentices in the Joinery Machining branch —

1 m Folding type rule, graduated in mm  
 Smoothing plane No. 4  
 Oilstone (double sided)  
 300 mm Combination square  
 750 mm Spirit level  
 Claw hammer  
 Screwdrivers large and small  
 Phillips screwdriver (medium)  
 Gauge  
 Pliers  
 Crescent spanners (two sizes)  
 Callipers  
 Nail punchers (3)  
 Hacksaw and blade.”
