NEW ZEALAND TIMBER INDUSTRY – AMENDMENT  
OF APPRENTICESHIP ORDER

Dated 6/12/76

In the Industrial Court of New Zealand – In the matter of the Apprentices Act 1948; and in the matter of the New Zealand Timber Industry Apprenticeship Order dated the 16th day of December 1969, recorded in 69 Book of Awards 2794.

Whereas by Section 13 (2) of the Apprentices Act 1948, the Court is empowered to amend any apprenticeship order: And whereas application has been made to the Court by the New Zealand Timber Industry Apprenticeship Committee for amendment of the New Zealand Timber Industry Apprenticeship Order dated the 16th day of December 1969: And whereas the Court has considered the recommendations made to it by the said Committee: Now, therefore, the Court, in pursuance and exercise of the powers vested in it by the said Act, doth hereby order as follows:

1. That the said apprenticeship order shall be amended by adding the following new subclauses (e) and (f) to clause 19 (Obligations of Employer):

19. (e) Every employer shall keep a fortnightly record in quadruplicate of service and training given to an apprentice for each 1,000-hour period of apprenticeship on a prescribed form for the purpose of any required inspection.

Copies of this record shall be distributed as resolved by the New Zealand Committee.

(f) In the event of transfer to another employer the apprentice's service and training record shall be transferred to his new employer who shall continue implementing subclauses (a) to (e) of this Clause.

2. That this order shall operate and take effect as from the day of the date hereof.
