



New Zealand Settlements Amendment Act 1864

Continues power to proclaim districts until 3 December, 1867.
- Type of Legislation:** Public
- Subject:** Confiscated Lands
- Relevant Sections:** s2: If Compensation Court refuses to award any compensation, or full amount claimed, Governor in Council may award compensation or increased compensation.
s3: Act to continue in operation until 3 December, 1865.
- Commentary:** In the Debates Weld says that this Amendment was necessary to ensure that the Imperial Government would not disallow the New Zealand Settlements Act 1863. When the 1863 Act was passed there was no limit to its duration, but it was now to become inoperative at the end of 1865. See, however, the New Zealand Settlements Amendment and Continuance Act 1865.
