- Relevant Sections:**
- s2:* Amends *s16* New Zealand Settlements Amendment and Continuance Act 1865 by repealing provision that land may only be sold for at least 10 shillings an acre, land may now be sold at a price prescribed by the Governor, for cash or otherwise.
 - s3:* Colonial Secretary may elect to pay compensation in land under *s10* New Zealand Settlements Amendment and Continuance Act 1865 before or after compensation award is made.
 - s4:* Land scrip may be granted in lieu of compensation in money. Scrip may be used to purchase land within the confiscated district.
 - s5:* Governor may make reserves out of confiscated land.
 - s6:* All proceedings under New Zealand Settlements Acts to be absolutely valid and not to be called into question.
 - s7:* Governor's proclamation of 2 September, 1865 not to be taken to entitle people to compensation who would have been excluded from compensation by the Acts.
 - s8:* Disposal of land to be under regulations made by the Governor in Council.
- Commentary:** The Debates make no comment about this Act, note however the blanket validation of all proceedings under the New Zealand Settlements Acts.
