Survey Issues

Compulsory Acquis & Transfer of Control

Relevant Sections: s89: Any Native land and land owned by Natives under title derived from the Crown may be taken for Public Work.

s90: Taking of Native land for work other than railway and defence work. Where title to the land is not derived from the Crown – map and survey to be prepared and Order in Council by the Governor to deem lands to be taken for public work. Where title to the land has been derived from the Crown, standard method set out in Part II may be used.

s91: Compensation for Native owners.

s92: Procedure for taking roads. No compensation payable for this.

s93: Over what lands roads may be laid off.

s94: Land occupied by any pa, village, burial ground, cultivation etc. may not be taken.

s99: Surveyors may not enter onto Native cultivations.
